For invitation, envelope and place card inscriptions, I normally require 1 - 2 weeks notice, but urgent requests will be given priority whenever possible.

Place card inscriptions can be left until 1 - 2 weeks before your wedding date, since guests can be slow to confirm their attendance. Even if your guest list is incomplete, I can make a start on the majority, then inscribe remaining names whenever you forward them to me.

Please complete a separate list for each stationery item, heading each list with a title, eg 'Day Invitations,' 'Day Envelopes,' 'Place Cards' etc.

Guest lists should be typed or word-processed (preferably not hand-written which may create errors resulting from illegibility).

Please ensure that length of guests' names is in relation to the amount of space available on your invitation, abbreviating where necessary.

The inclusion of a few extra stationery items is appreciated. Unused items will be returned.

Black ink will be used on all stationery items unless otherwise requested. Other colours are available — please ask.

Wherever possible, please avoid addresses of only three lines on envelopes. Add a fourth line by including the post code or county — this will enhance the appearance of the completed envelope. But, wherever possible, please try to keep the maximum to five lines to prevent overcrowding.

Due to the UK's notoriously changeable weather, I always address envelopes using water-resistant ink. It is worth noting that not all calligraphers provide this service as standard.

Stationery to be inscribed can be posted to me (recorded or special delivery recommended) or sent by courier. Please use appropriate protective packaging to avoid damage. If delivering stationery in person, please call me in advance to make arrangements. If I have to return stationery items by post, I will always charge postage at cost price and not arbitrarily inflated.
